Nets

Our regular Tuesday [Nets](#) are a good place to chat with other members and test your equipment and your range. We recommend you program our repeater frequency with a Tone Squelch since there's a repeater in the States that uses the same frequency. You should probably also program the two simplex frequencies we use on the evening net: 146.565 MHz and 446.100 MHz.

Club Events

Our calendar of events, on the right hand side of the screen contains all of the club events as well as some other events that might be of interest to our members. Clicking on any of the events (in green) will expand it and show more details.

On mobile devices, the sidebar (which contains the calendar and other links) is condensed in one tab. Clicking on this tab will reveal its content.

You'll also be able to help edit and grow the site if you feel comfortable doing so.

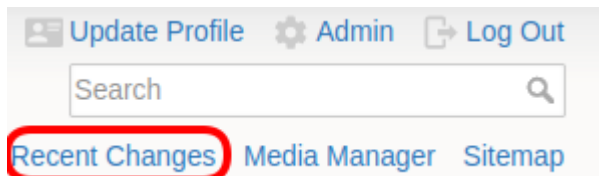

Sync.com

We have a shared folder on Sync.com that allows members to access shared files.

- To create an account, use this [referral link](#), which will give both the club and you an extra 1GB of storage.
- Once your account is created, send [Patrick](#) an email to let him know and he'll share the club's folder with you. Also let him know which email address you've used for the Sync.com registration if it's different than the one you usually use.
- We also encourage you to [download and install](#) the computer program and the phone app. They make sharing files with the rest of the members really easy.
